# Progress Report of Strategic Studies and District Improvement Items & Work Plan

#### **PURPOSE**

This paper aims to report to the Lantau Development Advisory Committee (LanDAC) on the progress of the strategic studies and district improvement items, and brief LanDAC on the work plan (the schedule is attached in **Annex 1**).

# VIEWS AND PROPOSALS OF THE MEMBERS AND PUBLIC ON THE LANTAU DEVELOPMENT

2. From March 2015 to August 2015, there were 22 more proposals from Members, totally 112; 37 new proposals were submitted by the public (different from those from Members) to increase the total number to 89. After consolidating these proposals, we submitted them to Members for reference and consideration.

#### **MAJOR STRATEGIC STUDIES**

3. The progress of the five major strategic studies is as follows:

	Item	Main Progress
1	Tung Chung New Town Extension	The environmental impact assessment report is scheduled for submission in the fourth quarter this year, while the outline zoning plan is scheduled for gazettal by end of this year.
2	Topside Development at Hong Kong Boundary Crossing Facilities Island of Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge	The Study commenced in January this year. The market positioning study for the proposed developments was completed in June. The Stage 1 Community Engagement to consult the public and major stakeholders on the initial development concept for the topside development was accomplished in September. The public's views received would be considered in the next stage of development plans formulation.

5. Below is the progress of the seven district improvement Items:

9	Improvement Works at Tai O	The Phase 2 Stage 1 works was gazetted in March this year. The construction was targeted for commencement in the middle of 2016 and completion in the second quarter of 2019.
10	Improvement Works at Mui Wo	The Phase 1 works commenced in July 2014 for completion by end 2016. The construction of the cycle tracks and footpath between Mui Wo Cooked Food Market and River Silver, and the improvement works near Mui Wo old town are underway.
		The Phase 2 Stage 1 of the car park improvement works was gazetted in December 2014. Detailed design is being carried out. The construction is anticipated to be commenced in the second quarter of 2016 for completion in early 2019.
11	Improvement Works at Ma Wan Chung Village	It will be carried out in parallel with the Tung Chung New Town Extension project.

15	Review on Traffic Restrictions and Arrangement of Closed Road Permits in South Lantau	The Transport Department (TD) proposes to increase the number of coaches that will be permitted to enter the roads in South Lantau per day from 30 to 50; and to permit 50 non-resident private cars to enter the roads in South Lantau on Monday to Friday (except public holidays) for leisure and recreation purposes; and has consulted the Traffic & Transport Subcommittee of LanDAC and all major stakeholders. TD is considering whether it is necessary to modify the proposals; and aims at implementing the proposals by end this year/early next year.

### **WORK PLAN OF LanDAC**

6. After more than a year of work, LanDAC has substantially formulated the proposed development strategies covering the planning, conservation, economic and social development, as well as recreation and tourism of Lantau. We will

consolidate the above strategies into a proposed overall development strategy for Lantau.

- 7. We propose to prepare a LanDAC report which not only summarises the work and major issues discussed by the first term of LanDAC, but also incorporates the proposed overall development strategy for Lantau. We expect to complete the report by the end of this year for issuance in early 2016, which will fit in with the public engagement and promotion activities.
- 8. We plan to launch the public engagement and promotion activities in the first quarter of 2016 to familiarise the Legislative Council, District Councils, the general public and other major stakeholders with the proposed overall development strategy for Lantau and gather their views, so that people from all sectors of the community will have a full understanding of this project that has a significant impact on the long-term and continuous development of Hong Kong. We expect to revise the proposed overall development strategy and map out a blueprint for Lantau development in the fourth quarter of 2016 in light of the views received during the consultation.
- 9. We will discuss with other departments and continue to liaise with non-government organisations and/or local groups to organise distinctive local activities or build local facilities, so as to enhance public enjoyment of the natural and cultural resources of Lantau and the pleasure they bring.

#### **CONCLUSION**

10. Members are invited to note and express their views on the progress of the various strategic studies and district improvement items, as well as the work plan of LanDAC.
