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# 1 Introduction

- 1.1 The Government has been continuously investing in capital works to improve people’s quality of life, promote Hong Kong’s economic development and enhance its long-term competitiveness. In the coming years, Hong Kong will experience a significant volume of upcoming mega-projects such as the Northern Metropolis, public housing, hospital development plan, transport infrastructure, etc. Meanwhile, the construction industry encounters many challenges, including high construction cost, ageing workforce, manpower shortage, declining productivity and site safety performance.
- 1.2 To cope with the challenges, in particular for the high construction cost, the Development Bureau (“DEVB”) has conducted a strategic study on construction costs (“the Strategic Study”), and identified five major reasons for the relatively high construction costs in Hong Kong<sup>1</sup> and four strategic directions<sup>2</sup>, one of the measures being the central procurement for Modular Integrated Construction (“MiC”) modules under the strategic direction of optimising the project procurement model. Different from the traditional subcontracting model of works with labour and materials inclusive, central procurement leverages on the principle of bulk purchase.
- 1.3 The Chief Executive has announced in his 2025 Policy Address that the DEVB will conduct central procurement on a trial basis this year, piloting in the procurement of commonly used materials including steel reinforcement and MiC modules, with an aim to saving costs.
- 1.4 The DEVB and the Architectural Services Department (“ArchSD”) are now considering the procurement and contractual arrangements for the Central Procurement Scheme for MiC Modules (“the Scheme”). Under the Scheme, a certain amount of MiC modules will be centrally procured for selected building projects which aims to better manage the supply chain, reduce material costs and thus lower the overall construction cost. ArchSD will administer this Scheme.

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<sup>1</sup> The five major reasons for high construction costs in Hong Kong include (1) labour cost; (2) contract risk premium on construction materials and equipment; (3) design standards and requirements; (4) approval process; and (5) project complexity.

<sup>2</sup> The four strategic directions include (1) optimising the project procurement model to reduce risk premium; (2) reviewing the design standards and requirements to increase cost effectiveness; (3) applying advanced technologies and construction methods to uplift productivity; and (4) streamlining the approval process to boost work efficiency.

- 1.5 The Government plans to engage suitable supplier(s) through open tender with the tentative timeline set out in Section 2. As such, we would like to launch an Expression of Interest (“EOI”) exercise and to obtain views before finalizing the tender documents.
- 1.6 This document (“Invitation Brochure”) invites EOI in tendering for the Scheme and obtains market feedback on how different aspects of the Scheme should be defined to encourage market participation and foster competition. For this purpose, particulars of proposed arrangement of the Scheme in broad terms are provided in this Invitation Brochure. It should however be noted that the particulars stated in this Invitation Brochure are on a non-committal basis, and are subject to changes by the Government without prior notification. For the avoidance of doubt, any received EOI will only be a reference and may or may not be considered or taken into account by the Government in the finalised Scheme details under tender documents and any other agreement.
- 1.7 Any party interested in putting forth an EOI submission (“Interested Party”) should make its own independent assessment of the information contained in this Invitation Brochure, and taking such professional and other advice as may be prudent in order to assess the risks and benefits and to prepare the EOI.
- 1.8 The submission of any EOI by an Interested Party shall be taken to be an acceptance of the terms of this Invitation Brochure.
- 1.9 This Invitation Brochure is not intended to provide the basis of any investment decision and should not be considered as a recommendation by the Government or any of its officers, agents or advisors to any Interested Party to submit any EOI.
- 1.10 This invitation exercise is not the beginning or part of the competitive bidding process. Neither this Invitation Brochure nor any submission received by the Government in response to this invitation exercise constitutes an offer or the basis of any contract which may be concluded.
- 1.11 This invitation exercise is not a prequalification exercise to shortlist or prequalify any Interested Party for the tender. Interested Parties who do not submit an EOI will not be barred from taking part, or prejudiced against, in the subsequent competitive bidding process under the Scheme.
- 1.12 In the case of a joint venture Interested Party, it shall nominate and appoint any one lead participant or major shareholder (“Lead Participant/Major Shareholder”) to act as the representative to make decisions on behalf of the joint venture and serve as a single contact point for the EOI.

- 1.13 Interested Parties shall not construe the contents of this Invitation Brochure, or any other communication by or on behalf of the Government, or any of its officers, agents or advisors, as any financial, legal, tax or other advice. Each Interested Party should consult its own professional advisors as to financial, legal, tax or other matters concerning the Scheme.
- 1.14 The Government may amend or cancel this invitation exercise at any time and reserves the right to vary the tender programme or cancel the intended tender exercise. All costs and expenses incurred by an Interested Party with respect to this invitation exercise shall be their sole responsibility. The Government shall not be liable for any cost, expense, and/or damages suffered or incurred by an Interested Party or any other person in connection with or arising out of the preparation, submission, presentation, clarification or negotiation of any Interested Party's EOI or otherwise in connection with the EOI process, including in the event that the Government decides to:
- (a) cancel the EOI process; or
  - (b) vary the tender programme; or
  - (c) not proceed with the tender exercise.
- 1.15 The Government may seek written clarifications from or request meetings with Interested Parties on the content of their EOI submissions. The Government may change the Scheme details, tender conditions and terms of other documents and agreements after the close of the EOI exercise.

## 3 Details

3.1 The terms set out in this section are only provisional and may be subject to changes until they are finalized in the Government's tender documents or related documents.

### 3.2 Overview of the Scheme

3.2.1 Under the Scheme, a certain amount of MiC modules will be centrally procured for selected building projects. The Scheme aims to better manage the supply chain, reduce material costs and thus lower the overall construction cost.

3.2.2 The Government is considering the appropriate procurement and contractual arrangements for the Scheme. The final contract form, arrangement, allocation of responsibilities as well as provisions will be set out in the Government's tender documents to be issued.

3.2.3 This EOI exercise seeks feedback from the market on the practical considerations associated with manufacturing, supply and delivery of MiC modules under a central procurement approach.

### 3.3 Scope and Duration

3.3.1 ArchSD will administer the Scheme.

3.3.2 The Scheme is intended to focus on steel MiC modules<sup>3</sup>. The indicative quantity of steel MiC modules to be procured under the Scheme is approximately 2,000 modules over the next three years.

3.3.3 Detailed technical requirements will be specified in the tender documents.

### 3.4 MiC Manufacturer Accreditation Scheme

3.4.1 Interested Parties should take note of DEVB's Technical Circular (Works) No. 2/2026 – "Modular Integrated Construction (MiC)", which sets out the policy on MiC adoption.

3.4.2 In accordance with DEVB's Technical Circular (Works) No. 2/2026, the Government adopts the Building Technology Research Institute ("BTRi")'s list of accredited MiC manufacturers under the Modular Integrated Construction

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<sup>3</sup> "Steel MiC Modules" are defined as modules units that are manufactured with steel as primary structural elements, including modules with steel frame and concrete floor.

Manufacturer Accreditation Scheme (“MiC-MAS”) as the list of approved MiC suppliers for public works projects with tenders to be invited on or after 1 April 2026.

### 3.5 **Tender Evaluation**

3.5.1 Tenders are expected to be evaluated based on a combined assessment of pricing, technical capability, capacity, experience and other relevant factors. The detailed evaluation methodology will be set out in the tender documents to be issued.

### 3.6 **Ordering and Delivery Arrangements**

3.6.1 The tender documents to be issued will set out the detailed arrangements on how MiC modules will be ordered (as applicable), how delivery to designated construction site(s) will be coordinated, and any mechanisms that may be adopted to manage and safeguard delivery, quality and performance under the Scheme.

## 4 Submission

4.1 An Interested Party is invited to submit an EOI in the following manner:

- (a) An Interested Party must return two copies of duly completed attached Reply Form together with the required information and documents stated therein (as the EOI in sealed plain envelope(s) marked “**Confidential**” and labelled “**Expression of Interest for Central Procurement Scheme for Modular Integrated Construction Modules**”) but should not bear any indication relating to the name or identity of the Interested Party. **The Interested Party must deposit the said sealed envelope(s) in Development Bureau (Works Branch)’s Drop-in Box at 2/F Entrance, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong by 12:00 noon on 6 August 2026 (Thursday) (“Closing Date”).**
- (b) In case a black rainstorm warning or a tropical cyclone warning signal No. 8 or above or an announcement on “extreme conditions” caused by super typhoon is issued by the Hong Kong Observatory being in force at any time between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on the Closing Date, the specified closing time of the Invitation will be extended to 12:00 noon on the next working day on which no black rainstorm warning or typhoon signal No. 8 or above or announcement on “extreme conditions” caused by super typhoon is in force.
- (c) In case of any actual or anticipated blockage of the public access to the location of the Development Bureau (Works Branch)’s Drop-in Box, or closure of the East Wing, Central Government Offices, or suspension of all public transport in Hong Kong for whatever reasons at any time between the hours of 9:00 am and 12:00 noon on the Closing Date, DEVB may extend the specified closing time of the invitation and/or the Closing Date if it shall consider necessary (such extension shall be made at the sole discretion of DEVB) by making announcement of such extension at any time before the closing time of the invitation on DEVB’s website. For the avoidance of doubt, the specified closing time of the invitation and the Closing Date shall remain unchanged if no such announcement is made by DEVB.

4.2 Any EOI which is not in conformity with the requirements stipulated in this Invitation Brochure may not be considered. Late submissions and EOI not deposited in the Development Bureau (Works Branch)’s Drop-in Box in accordance with the aforesaid provisions will not be accepted.

- 4.3 DEVB will within seven (7) working days after the Closing Date issue via email (to the email address indicated in the Reply Form submitted by the Interested Party) an acknowledgment of receipt of EOI to the Interested Party which has submitted the EOI in accordance with the aforesaid provisions.
- 4.4 After the Closing Date, the Government may make a request in writing to the Interested Party who has submitted an EOI to provide further information regarding the submission made, and such Interested Party shall reply in writing within fourteen (14) calendar days.
- 4.5 The Government reserves its right to proceed, or not to proceed further with this invitation exercise and/or the future tender exercise at the Government's absolute discretion without giving any reasons for the decision. The Government shall not be liable to any party for any loss or damage, costs or expense arising out of such Government's decisions.

It should be noted that DEVB will only answer questions of a general nature and will not provide legal or any other advice.

- 4.8 It is hereby specifically declared by the Government that any statement made, whether oral or written, and any action taken by any Government officer in response to any enquiry made by any Interested Party shall be for guidance and reference purposes only. The Government does not bind itself to any statement made in relation to the Scheme.
- 4.9 By submission of an EOI, each of the Interested Parties gives its consent to the disclosure of its name (including the name of the Interested Party and its participants/shareholders (for joint venture)) provided in the EOI submission and accepts and acknowledges that the Government has the right to disclose such information. The Government shall have no liability in respect of any loss, damage, nuisance or disturbance whatsoever caused to or suffered by the Interested Party or any other person, whether arising out of, in connection with or incidental to the exercise of the Government's right to disclose the name (including the name of the Interested Party and its participant/shareholder (for joint venture)) in the EOI
