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1 Introduction

- 1.1 The Government has been continuously investing in capital works to improve people's quality of life, promote Hong Kong's economic development and enhance its long-term competitiveness. In the coming years, Hong Kong will experience a significant volume of upcoming mega-projects such as the Northern Metropolis, public housing, transport infrastructure, etc. Meanwhile, the construction industry encounters many challenges, including high construction cost, ageing workforce, manpower shortage, declining productivity and site safety performance.
- 1.2 To cope with the challenges, in particular for the high construction cost, the Development Bureau (DEVB) has conducted a strategic study on construction costs (the Strategic Study), and identified five major reasons for the relatively high construction costs in Hong Kong¹ and four strategic directions², one of which being the central procurement for steel reinforcement under the strategic direction of optimising the project procurement model.
- 1.3 Hong Kong's annual steel reinforcement consumption is around 1,800,000 tonnes, with about 800,000 tonnes used for public works projects. Different to the traditional subcontracting model of works with labour and materials inclusive and leveraging on the principle of bulk purchase, the Chief Executive has announced in his 2025 Policy Address that the DEVB will conduct central procurement on a trial basis this year, piloting in the procurement of commonly used materials including steel reinforcement and Modular Integrated Construction ("MiC") modules, in order to save costs.
- 1.4 The DEVB and Civil Engineering and Development Department (CEDD) are now working on the framework contract for the Central Procurement Scheme for Steel Reinforcement (the Scheme). Under the Scheme, a certain amount of steel reinforcement will be centrally procured and tested which aims to streamline the testing process, better manage the supply chain, reduce material costs and thus lower the overall construction cost and CEDD will administer this Scheme.

¹ The five major reasons for high construction costs in Hong Kong include (1) labour cost; (2) contract risk premium on construction materials and equipment; (3) design standards and requirements; (4) approval process; and (5) project complexity.

² The four strategic directions include (1) optimising the project procurement model to reduce risk premium; (2) reviewing the design standards and requirements to increase cost effectiveness; (3) applying advanced technologies and construction methods to uplift productivity; and (4) streamlining the approval process to boost work efficiency.

- 1.5 The Government wishes to engage the Framework Contractors³ through open tender with the timeline set out in Section 2. As such, we would like to launch an Expression of Interest (“EOI”) exercise and to obtain views before finalising the tender documents.
- 1.6 This document (“Invitation Brochure”) invites EOI in the tendering for the Scheme and obtain market feedback on how different aspects of the Scheme should be defined to encourage market participation and foster competition. For this purpose, particulars of proposed arrangement of the Scheme in broad terms are provided in this Invitation Brochure. It should however be noted that the particulars stated in this Invitation Brochure are on a non-committal basis, and are subject to changes by the Government without prior notification. For the avoidance of doubt, any received EOI will only be a reference and may or may not be considered or taken into account by the Government in the finalised Scheme details under tender documents and any other agreement.
- 1.7 Any party interested in putting forth an EOI submission (“Interested Party”) should make its own independent assessment of the information contained in this Invitation Brochure, and taking such professional and other advice as may be prudent in order to assess the risks and benefits and to prepare the EOI.
- 1.8 The submission of any EOI by an Interested Party shall be taken to be an acceptance of the terms of this Invitation Brochure.
- 1.9 This Invitation Brochure is not intended to provide the basis of any investment decision and should not be considered as a recommendation by the Government or any of its officers, agents or advisors to any Interested Party to submit any EOI.
- 1.10 This invitation exercise is not the beginning or part of the competitive bidding process. Neither this Invitation Brochure nor any submission received by the Government in response to this invitation exercise constitutes an offer or the basis of any contract which may be concluded.
- 1.11 This invitation exercise is not a prequalification exercise to shortlist or prequalify any Interested Party for the tender. Interested Parties who do not submit an EOI will not be barred from taking part, or prejudiced against, in the subsequent competitive bidding for the framework contract of Central Procurement Scheme for Steel Reinforcement.

³ “Framework Contractors” are the successful tenderer(s) awarded with a framework contract to supply steel reinforcement to the Government throughout the framework contract period.

- 1.12 In the case of a consortium, it shall nominate and appoint any one lead member (“Lead Member”) to act as the representative to make decisions on behalf of the consortium and serve as a single contact point for the EOI.
- 1.13 Interested parties shall not construe the contents of this Invitation Brochure, or any other communication by or on behalf of the Government, or any of its officers, agents or advisors, as any financial, legal, tax or other advice. Each Interested Party should consult its own professional advisors as to financial, legal, tax or other matters concerning the Central Procurement Scheme for Steel Reinforcement.
- 1.14 The Government may amend or cancel this invitation exercise at any time and reserves the right to vary the tender programme or cancel the intended tender exercise. Interested Parties will be notified of any such amendment or cancellation. All costs and expenses incurred by an Interested Party with respect to the EOI process shall be their sole responsibility. The Government shall not be liable for any cost, expense, and/or damages suffered or incurred by an Interested Party or any other person in connection with or arising out of the preparation, submission, presentation, clarification or negotiation of any Interested Party’s EOI or otherwise in connection with the EOI process, including in the event that the Government decides to:
- (a) cancel the EOI process; or
 - (b) not proceed with the tender exercise.
- 1.15 The Government may seek written clarifications from or request meetings with Interested Parties on the content of their EOI submissions. The Government may change the Scheme details, tender conditions and terms of other documents and agreements after the close of the EOI exercise.

3 Details

The terms set out in this section are only provisional and may be subject to changes until they are finalised in the Government's tender documents or related documents.

3.1 Framework Contract

3.1.1 Form of Framework Contract

Latest edition of NEC4 Framework Contract published by Thomas Telford Ltd and the additional conditions of contract are to be adopted.

3.1.2 The Scope and Duration

3.1.2.1 CEDD will administer this Central Procurement Scheme for Steel Reinforcement.

3.1.2.2 A provisional estimate of 300,000 tonnes of 12-meter run plain or ribbed steel reinforcement of various diameters will be procured through a series of Supply Orders under the Framework Contract.

3.1.2.3 Duration of a Framework Contract is provisionally set at three (3) years from the commencement date.

3.1.2.4 Framework Contractors will be invited to submit quotation for Supply Orders by the Central Procurement Team⁴ with rates submitted in the quotation not exceeding the ceiling rate (with adjustment for inflation) submitted in the tender for the Framework Contract.

3.1.2.5 Framework Contractors are required to operate storage yard(s) to facilitate storage and arrangement of central testing of steel reinforcement at their own cost over the course of the Framework Contract.

3.1.2.6 Framework Contractors are required to maintain quality management systems and measures over the course of the Framework Contract and Supply Orders. This shall include but not be limited to a traceability system (e.g. logistic management, sampling and recording procedures, coding system, surveillance system and substandard materials arrangement) to ensure full traceability of steel reinforcement across stages: from purchasing from Quality Assured Manufacturer, undergoing central sampling and testing to delivery to specified site(s) as ordered

by the Central Procurement Team at their own cost over the course of the Framework Contract.

3.1.3 **Tenderers' selection criteria**

Tenderers for a Framework Contract must fulfil the eligibility requirements of being a Quality Assured Stockist under Construction Standard CS2:2012. Eligible and conforming tenders are to be evaluated based on a combined score taking into account factors such as the tendered all-inclusive ceiling prices (inclusive of supply and delivery of central-tested steel reinforcement to designated construction site(s) as instructed under Supply Orders), current capability and past experiences. The Framework Contract will then be awarded to a pre-determined number of conforming tenderers selected based on the evaluation criteria specified in the conditions of tender.

3.1.4 **Number of Framework Contractors to be engaged**

Several tenderers (number of framework contractor to be determined) are to be engaged as Framework Contractors in the Framework Contract based on the tenderers' selection criteria as stipulated in 3.1.3 above.

3.1.5 **Award of Supply Orders to Framework Contractors**

- 3.1.5.1 During the Framework Contract, the Central Procurement Team will invite Framework Contractors to submit quotations for Supply Orders in accordance with the terms set out in the quotation documents. Please refer to para. 3.1.5.2 to 3.1.5.4 and 3.2 for further details. Prices and factors such as failure rates to submit quotation upon invitation will be taken into account for award of Supply Orders.
- 3.1.5.2 Unit rates for steel reinforcement submitted in the Framework Contractor's quotations shall not exceed the ceiling rates (adjusted for inflation) submitted with the Framework Contractor's tender for the Framework Contract.
- 3.1.5.3 Approximate quantities of each diameter of steel reinforcement to be requested in the Supply Order will be provided in the quotation documents and will be adopted also for quotation evaluation purposes. The said approximate quantities will serve

as forecast and reference only. The final order quantities will be subject to adjustment.

- 3.1.5.4 Orders to deliver steel reinforcement to designated construction site(s) at the specified date/time will be instructed over the course of the Supply Order.

3.2 Supply Orders

3.2.1 Duration for Supply Orders

Duration for each Supply Order will be stated in the quotation documents and will not exceed 12 months.

3.2.2 Form of Supply Order and Payment Term

Latest edition of NEC4 Supply Short Contract published by Thomas Telford Ltd and the additional conditions of contract are to be adopted in the quotation documents for each Supply Order. The Central Procurement Team will administer the Supply Orders.

3.2.3 The Scope of Supply Orders

- 3.2.3.1 Progressive supply of central-tested steel reinforcement of various sizes is to be instructed through an online digital platform at specified time over the course of the Supply Order. Total quantities to be delivered over the course of the Supply Order will be stated in the quotation documents.

- 3.2.3.2 The Supplier⁵ of a particular Supply Order will be required to plan and liaise with Central Procurement Team to progressively facilitate sampling of central-tested steel reinforcement, with central testing of steel reinforcement to be conducted by the designated agency as delegated by the Client.

- 3.2.3.3 Periodic update of forecast programme for issuance of Supply Order to deliver steel reinforcement will be provided to the Supplier through the online digital platform in order to facilitate the Supplier's own planning of its upstream procurement of steel reinforcement.

⁵ "Supplier" is the Framework Contractor whose quotation is accepted by the Government to supply steel reinforcement in a particular Supply Order.

3.2.3.4 Works Contractors⁶ (with Central Procurement Team overseeing the process) will place orders to deliver steel reinforcement specifying the following details :

- Date and time of delivery
- Location
- Quantities of steel reinforcement

3.2.3.5 The Supplier will be required to liaise, counter-propose, confirm and agree with the Works Contractors with regards to above particulars to deliver steel reinforcement, with proper recording through the online digital platform. The Supplier will be required to upload all necessary supporting documents to the online digital platform with regard to the batch of steel reinforcement delivered.

⁶ "Works Contractor" is the contractor undertaking a works contract with steel reinforcement bars supplied under this Framework Contract.

4 Submission

4.1.1.1 Interested Party is invited to submit an EOI in the following manner:

- (a) Interested Party must return two copies of duly completed attached Reply Form together with the required information and documents stated therein (as the EOI in sealed plain envelope(s) marked “**Confidential**” and labelled “**Expression of Interest for Central Procurement Scheme for Steel Reinforcement**”) but should not bear any indication relating to the name or identity of the Interested Party. **Interested Party must deposit the said sealed envelope(s) in Development Bureau (Works Branch)’s Drop-in Box at 2/F Entrance, East Wing, Central Government Offices, 2 Tim Mei Avenue, Tamar, Hong Kong by 12:00 noon on 12 May 2026 (Tuesday) (“Closing Date”).**
- (b) In case a black rainstorm warning or a tropical cyclone warning signal No. 8 or above or an announcement on “extreme conditions” caused by super typhoon is issued by the Hong Kong Observatory being in force at any time between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on the Closing Date, the specified closing time of the Invitation will be extended to 12:00 noon on the next working day on which no black rainstorm warning or typhoon signal No. 8 or above or announcement on “extreme conditions” caused by super typhoon is in force.
- (c) In case of any actual or anticipated blockage of the public access to the location of the Development Bureau (Works Branch)’s Drop-in Box in certain areas of Hong Kong or closure of DEVB’s office or suspension of all public transport in Hong Kong for whatever reasons at any time between the hours of 9:00am and 12:00 noon on the Closing Date, DEVB may extend the closing time of the Invitation and/or the Closing Date if it shall consider necessary (such extension shall be made at the sole discretion of DEVB) by making announcement of such extension at any time before or after the closing time of the Invitation on DEVB’s website. For the avoidance of doubt, the specified closing time of the Invitation and the Closing Date shall remain unchanged if no such announcement shall be made by DEVB.

- 4.1.1.2 Any EOI which is not in conformity with the requirements stipulated in this Invitation Brochure may not be considered. Late submissions and EOI not deposited in the designated box of DEVB in accordance with the aforesaid provisions will not be accepted.
- 4.1.1.3 DEVB will within seven (7) working days after the Closing Date issue via email (to the email address indicated in the Reply Form submitted by the Interested Party) an acknowledgment of receipt of EOI to the Interested Party which has submitted the EOI in accordance with the aforesaid provisions.
- 4.1.1.4 After the Closing Date, the Government may request in writing the Interested Party who has submitted an EOI to provide further information regarding the submission made, and the Interested Party shall reply in writing within fourteen (14) calendar days.
- 4.1.1.5 The Government reserves its right to proceed, or not to proceed further with this invitation exercise and/or the tender exercise at the Government's absolute discretion without giving any reasons for the decision. The Government shall not be liable to any party for any loss or damage, costs or expense arising out of such Government's decisions.
