PUBLIC HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS AT CHEUNG MUK TAU

TAKE NOTICE that under powers delegated by the Chief Executive, I have made an order under section 17(1)(a) of the Roads (Works, Use and Compensation) Ordinance (Chapter 370) (hereinafter referred to as 'the Ordinance') as applied by section 26 of the Water Pollution Control (Sewerage) Regulation (Chapter 358, Subsidiary Legislation AL) directing that the existing carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, pedestrian crossings, amenity areas and central reserves/refuge islands or parts thereof within the limit of works area as shown on Plan No. CE19/GZ/003 ('the Plan') and described in the scheme annexed thereto, which the Plan and scheme were referred to in G.N. 4590 published on 26 August 2022 and 2 September 2022, shall be closed temporarily and has further declared under section 17(1)(c) of the Ordinance as applied by section 26 of the Water Pollution Control (Sewerage) Regulation (Chapter 358, Subsidiary Legislation AL) that as from 22 September 2026 to 21 September 2027, all public or private rights in, upon, under or over the above affected existing carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, pedestrian crossings, amenity areas and central reserves/refuge islands or parts thereof to be temporarily closed, shall be extinguished, modified or restricted, as the case may be, during that period.

The sewerage works to be carried out on the above affected existing carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, pedestrian crossings, amenity areas and central reserves/refuge islands mainly involve:—

- (i) construction of approximate 1 100 metres of gravity sewers and associated manholes within the limit of works area as shown on the Plan; and
- (ii) Ancillary works including reinstatement of existing carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, pedestrian crossings, amenity areas and central reserves/refuge islands.

A copy of the order and the Plan showing the above affected existing carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, pedestrian crossings, amenity areas and central reserves/refuge islands or parts thereof may be inspected by members of the public, free of charge, at the following locations and during the following hours when those offices are normally open to the public:—

This notice will be affixed on or near the existing carriageways, footpaths, cycle tracks, pedestrian crossings, amenity areas and central reserves/refuge islands affected on 11 September 2026.

Any person having a compensable interest under the Water Pollution Control (Sewerage) Regulation (Chapter 358, Subsidiary Legislation AL) may serve upon the Secretary for the Environment and Ecology a written claim, before the expiration of one year from the date of closure, extinction, modification or restriction, which can be submitted *via* one of the following means:—

Personal Information Collection Statement

Any information, including the personal data, submitted to the Secretary for Environment and Ecology in connection with any written claims served under Part VI of the Water Pollution Control (Sewerage) Regulation (Chapter 358, Subsidiary Legislation AL) will be used for the processing of the claims and other related purposes. The provision of any information, including the personal data, as required under Part VI of the Water Pollution Control (Sewerage) Regulation (Chapter 358, Subsidiary Legislation AL) is obligatory. If such information, including the personal data, as required under Part VI of the Water Pollution Control (Sewerage) Regulation (Chapter 358, Subsidiary Legislation AL) is not provided as requested, the claims may be rejected. Any information, including the personal data, so submitted may be disclosed to the relevant government departments and other persons, organizations or agencies which are required to handle the claims and related matters. Persons who have so submitted their personal data have the rights to request access to and correction of their personal data in relation to their claims.
