The development of the performance-based regulatory system is an on-going process. Most of the consultancy studies commissioned by the Buildings Department on various aspects of planning, safety and construction requirements have been completed. We have been seeking the views of the building professionals and industry through the established consultation mechanism during the various studies and the formulation of legislative amendments to the relevant building regulations to introduce the proposed performance-based requirements. The relevant legislative amendments will be introduced in phases starting late 2009.
