#### LANTAU DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Progress Report of Strategic Studies and District Improvement Items, and Work Plan of the Lantau Development Advisory Committee

#### **PURPOSE**

This paper aims to report to the Lantau Development Advisory Committee (LanDAC) on the progress of the strategic studies and district improvement items (the schedule is attached in **Annex 1**), and brief LanDAC on the latest work plan.

#### **MAJOR STRATEGIC STUDIES**

2. The progress of the five major strategic studies is as follows:

	Item	Main Progress
1	Tung Chung New Town Extension <sup>1</sup>	The Outline Zoning Plan and the reclamation works have been gazetted in January 2016. The detailed design and site investigation works are scheduled for commencement in mid-2016.
2	Topside Development at Hong Kong Boundary Crossing Facilities (HKBCF) Island of Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge (HZMB)	for completion in 2017. Stage 1 Community Engagement was accomplished in September 2015.

	Item	Main Progress
		viability and technical feasibility assessments of the proposed development options including the assessment of environmental and traffic impacts, etc. are in progress. We will conduct the Stage 2 Community Engagement in the third quarter of this year to consult the public on the draft Recommended Outline Development Plan.
3	Siu Ho Wan Reclamation	The first stage technical study commenced in July 2015 with target completion in the first quarter of 2017. The consultants are formulating conceptual options of preliminary reclamation extent, land use themes, road and railway connections, which are for assessing the preliminary technical feasibility of the proposed developments.
4	Sunny Bay Reclamation	Subject to funding approval of the Legislative Council (LegCo), the study will commence in the first quarter of 2017.
5	East Lantau Metropolis	Subject to funding approval of the LegCo, the study will commence in the first quarter of 2017.

7	Study on Recreation and Tourism Development Strategy for Lantau	The Study commenced in March 2015, and it is expected to complete in the third quarter of 2016. The consultants have formulated the vision, mission and guiding principles of the proposed recreation and tourism development strategy for Lantau, as well as the preliminary planning framework (including 5 themes and 14 recreation and tourism areas) and the possible development options as the basis for the public engagement. The consultants are now continuing the capacity of receiving tourists assessment and the strategic traffic and transport assessment, together with the advance preliminary feasibility studies (including financial viability) and broad technical assessments for shortlisted proposals.

8	Preliminary Feasibility Study of Cable Car System from Ngong Ping to Tai O, and Spa and Resort Development at Cheung Sha and Soko Islands	2015 and is scheduled for completion by the third quarter of 2016.

9	Improvement Works at Tai O	The Phase 2 Stage 1 works comprise improvement of public transport terminus and public car park, construction of entrance plaza and ancillary facilities including cycle parking area and parking spaces for goods vehicles and coaches. Subject to funding approval by the LegCo, the works are anticipated to be commenced in the third quarter of 2016

		for completion in the third quarter of 2019.
10	Improvement Works at Mui Wo	The Phase 1 improvement works commenced in July 2014. The children playground inside the civic square was officially open in January 2016. The cycle track and pedestrian walkway between the Mui Wo Cooked Food Market and River Silver and the improvement works in Mui Wo old town are under construction and scheduled for completion in end 2016.
		The Phase 2 Stage 1 works for improvement of the carpark is scheduled to commence in mid-2016 for completion in early 2019, subject to funding approval by the LegCo.
11	Mountain Bike Trail Networks	The Phase 1 works commenced in end of last year and are anticipated to be completed by end of this year.
		We are now engaging consultants for the design and supervision of the Phase 2 works. Subject to the funding approval by the LegCo, the works are anticipated to commence in the first quarter of 2017 for the completion in the first quarter of 2018.
12	Improvement to Narrow Road Bends at Keung Shan Road	Out of the 16 road bends for improvement at Keung Shan Road, 9 have been completed. The progress of the remaining 7 is summarised as follows:

13	Improvement to Narrow Road Bends at South Lantau Road	Out of the 5 road bends for improvement at South Lantau Road, 4 have been completed. The progress of the remaining bend improvement is summarised as follows:  • Bend S1 – The works are scheduled to commence in mid-2016 for completion in end 2016.  (The location of the bend improvement works concerned is shown in <b>Annex 3</b> .)
14	Review on Traffic Restriction and Arrangement of Closed Road Permit in South Lantau	The Transport Department (TD) is implementing the first-phase measure. Since 25 December 2015, the limit on the number of tour coaches permitted to enter south Lantau per day was increased to 40. Moreover, from 26 February 2016, the TD launched "Driving on Lantau Island" Scheme, permitting 25 private cars to enter south Lantau from Mondays to Fridays (except public holidays) from 8.00 a.m. to 7.00 p.m. for leisure and recreational purposes. Amongst the quota of 25, five will be allocated to electric private cars for promoting environmental protection.  Upon implementation of the above-mentioned measure, the TD will

		closely monitor the traffic as well as the supply and utilisation of parking spaces in south Lantau.
15	Improvement Works to Tung Chung – Tai O Ancient Trail	Refurbishment and installation of signage, information boards, pavilion and hand railing for the trail are in progress. The works are expected to complete in the second quarter of 2016.

#### WORK PLAN OF LANDAC

- 5. The major work target of LanDAC for this year is to analyse the views gathered during the three-month public engagement exercise for Lantau Development which was concluded on 30 April 2016, and prepare the public engagement report. The Development Bureau and the departments concerned will consolidate LanDAC's proposals and the public's views to draw up the Blueprint for Lantau Development in the second half of this year, so as to set out broad timetables for various studies and projects. We expect to announce the Blueprint for Lantau Development at the end of this year or early next year. Subsequently, we will consult LanDAC on the general implementation arrangements for the Blueprint for Lantau Development.
- 6. To ensure continuous public awareness of and support on Lantau Development, we will keep on organising promotional activities, and will explore, plan and take forward appropriate measures and work.
- 7. To provide support for LanDAC's work, we propose the establishment of the Public Relations and Promotion Subcommittee, the Planning and Conservation Subcommittee, and the Traffic, Transport and District Improvement Items Subcommittee (the proposed compositions of the subcommittees are at **Annex 4**). The major responsibilities of each subcommittee are listed as follows:
  - The Public Relations and Promotion Subcommittee: to assist in analysing the views gathered during the public engagement exercise and preparing the public engagement report, and to organise and publicise promotional activities;


- The Planning and Conservation Subcommittee: to assist in the work relating to the aspects of planning (including recreation and tourism) and conservation, and to explore and plan appropriate conservation, recreation and tourism proposals and measures; and
- The Traffic, Transport and District Improvement Items Subcommittee: to assist in the exploration and planning of appropriate traffic and transport arrangements and district improvement items.




