LANTAU DEVELOPMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Public Relation and Engagement Subcommittee Progress Report

PURPOSE

This paper aims to report the work progress and work plan of the Public Relation and Engagement Subcommittee (PRE SC) to the Lantau Development Advisory Committee (LanDAC).

WORK PROGRESS

2. The third meeting and a special meeting of PRE SC were held on 12 January and 11 February 2015 respectively.

Third Meeting

3. The progress of various tasks (**PRE SC Paper No. 01/2015 – Work Progress Report**) was reported at the third meeting of PRE SC. PRE SC noted that up to 31 December 2014, the Government together with PRE SC had attended four events for promoting the development of Lantau (**See Appendix 1**).

4. PRE SC noted that the Development Bureau had completed the production of leaflets and posters for promoting the development of Lantau (**See Appendix 2**) and the scripts of the promotional videos were being drafted.

5. PRE SC noted that preparation work for engagement of the public relations consultant was being carried out by the Civil Engineering and Development Department (CEDD). It was planned to place the tender notice on CEDD's webpage in end March 2015 and conduct selection work in April 2015. The public relations consultant is expected to commence work in June 2015 and complete the draft comprehensive publicity, public relations and consultation strategy and plan in October 2015.

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6. The recommended follow-up actions on comments received at promotion events (**PRE SC Paper No. 02/2015 – Recommended Follow-up Actions on Comments Received at Promotion Events**) were endorsed by PRE SC. PRE SC Secretariat has referred the comments to various Subcommittees under LanDAC or the relevant government departments for following up after the meeting (**See Appendix 3 for details and follow-up**) and will report on the corresponding responses in future PRE SC meetings.

7. The proposed public promotion events and short-term work for the first half year of 2015 were endorsed by PRE SC (**PRE SC Paper No. 03/2015 – Proposed Outreach Activities in the First Half Year of 2015 and Short-term Work**).

8. PRE SC Secretariat will continue to coordinate with the promotion or exchange platforms or social networks with which PRE SC members are associated and update the schedule of promotion events in the first half year of 2015 in due course to facilitate the attendance of the relevant events by the Government and/or PRE SC members (**See Appendix 4 for the latest schedule**).

9. PRE SC noted that the Government proposed uploading the completed promotional leaflets, posters and videos onto current LanDAC's webpage for public viewing as short-term work. PRE SC Secretariat has uploaded the Chinese and English versions of the promotional leaflets and posters onto LanDAC's webpage after the meeting.

10. PRE SC members commented on the promotion events, design and operation of LanDAC's new website, scripts of the promotional videos, etc. at the meeting.

Special Meeting

11. To collect PRE SC members' comments on the production of the promotional videos, PRE SC convened a special meeting as a preview session of the promotional videos on 11 February 2105. At the same time, PRE SC Secretariat invited the Chairpersons and Deputy Chairpersons of other Subcommittees under LanDAC to attend preview session and comment on the production of the videos (**See Appendix 5 for attendance list**).

12. PRE SC Secretariat played the first draft of two promotional videos at the

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preview session. The Government will arrange for the production company to make suitable modifications to the videos in light of the comments received. PRE SC noted that the production of the promotional videos was expected to complete in early 2nd quarter of 2015.

WORK PLAN

13. PRE SC planned to visit the 18 district councils in the territory to introduce and promote the development of Lantau. PRE SC visited the Islands District Council, Tsuen Wan District Council and Yuen Long District Council respectively on 15 December 2014, 27 January 2015 and 17 February 2015. PRE SC expected to visit the remaining 15 district councils by July 2015 (**See Appendix 6 for the timetable of visiting the 18 district councils**).

14. PRE SC was planning to attend public forums, school promotion events as well as seminars for professional bodies, etc. in the 2nd/3rd quarters of 2015.

CONCLUSION

15. LanDAC is invited to note the work progress and work plan of PRE SC and give its views.

香港在珠三角區域一直擔當重要角色，而大嶼山憑著其優越的地理位置及各項大型基建發展，將成為香港、澳門和珠三角的交匯點，發展潛力將大幅提升，對香港持續發展具策略性的地位。

策略性定位

1 大珠三角國際運輸、物流及貿易樞紐

大嶼山連接香港國際機場及往市區的青馬大橋，加上港珠澳大橋和屯門至赤鱗角連接路陸續落成，大嶼山的交通基建優勢將進一步提升香港與內地和海外連繫。善用這連繫通達性，可加強香港作為國際運輸、物流及貿易樞紐的角色。

2 大珠三角地區和亞洲的服務樞紐

大嶼山匯聚各項大型基建和交通建設的優勢，前往大部分珠三角城市只需少於三小時，並提供連接亞洲多聯的航空交通。把連繫通達性的優勢，可幫助香港優良的法律、醫療、金融和教育設施在內地及亞洲擴充業務，令香港進一步發展成為一站式高增值現代服務樞紐。

3 策略性增長地區及新的大都會

大嶼山與香港島之間的中部水域鄰近現有商業區，可發展成為容納數十萬人口的新都會及香港第三個核心商業區，促進經濟發展和提供大量就業機會，舒緩現時市中心過度擠迫的情況。

4 自然資產寶藏

大嶼山大部分地區為郊野公園和天然海岸，景觀優美，動植物種類繁多。這個自然資產寶藏和島上其他多樣化旅遊設施可產生協同效應，為旅客提供綜合保育、文化、文物、娛樂和旅遊的旅程體驗。

發展方向

在2007年發表的「經修訂的大嶼山發展概念計劃」及前述的策略性定位的基礎上，大嶼山發展諮詢委員會訂出以下四個發展方向：

1 北大嶼山走廊 (作經濟及房屋發展)

北大嶼山走廊沿途有香港國際機場、東涌新市鎮擴展及其他主要基建，可提供大量機會作房屋、經濟及商業發展。

2 東北大嶼山匯點 (作休閒、娛樂及旅遊)

配合東北大嶼山現有的休閒設施，進一步加入多元化的旅遊、娛樂元素，鞏固香港作為亞洲旅遊中心及盛事之都的地位。

3 東大嶼都會 (設有核心商業區的策略發展區域)

在中部水域興建一個或以上的人工島，建設多一個核心商業區及新市鎮，可滿足香港可持續發展的長遠需要。東大嶼都會將採用智能、多元化及環保新市鎮概念，並有交通基建連接接到香港島的主要地區。

4 大嶼山大部分地區 (作保育、消閒、文化及綠色旅遊)

大嶼山擁有多姿多彩的自然生態環境、鄉村市鎮、文化和文物景點，在保存固有及獨有特色下，極具潛力加強發展休閒、文化及綠色旅遊。

Hong Kong has been playing a pivotal role in the Pearl River Delta (PRD) region. With its premier geographical location and various large-scale infrastructure developments, Lantau has huge growth potential, and is set to become the convergence point of Hong Kong, Macau and the PRD and play a strategic role in Hong Kong's sustainable development.

Strategic Positioning

1 International Transport, Logistics and Trade Hub in PRD

Lantau is connected to the Hong Kong International Airport (HKIA) and the Tsing Ma Bridge that leads to downtown areas. With the future completion of the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge and the Tuen Mun - Chek Lap Kok Link, Lantau's edge in transport infrastructure will further enhance Hong Kong's network with the Mainland and overseas. Leveraging on Lantau's connectivity, Hong Kong's role as an international transport, logistics and trade hub will be strengthened.

2 Connecting Services in Greater PRD Region and Asia

With large-scale infrastructure projects and a comprehensive transportation network, the travelling time between Lantau and most PRD cities can be within three hours and the island enjoys convenient flight connections with many Asian cities and towns. Capitalising on this connectivity edge, Hong Kong can further develop as a one-stop and high-value modern service hub that facilitates business expansion of the city's well-respected legal, medical, financial and education services on the Mainland and in Asia.

3 Strategic Growth Area with New Metropolis

The central waters between Lantau and Hong Kong Island are close to the existing business districts. The area has the potential to be developed into a new metropolis that can accommodate hundreds of thousands of people and become a third core business district in Hong Kong, expanding economic development and job opportunities as well as relieving the existing overcrowding situation of the urban core.

4 Treasure of Natural Assets

Most of Lantau is covered by country parks and surrounded by natural coastlines with scenic landscapes and a rich diversity of flora and fauna. This treasure of natural assets together with diverse tourism facilities on the island will create greater synergy for a wide range of visitor experiences spanning conservation, culture, heritage, entertainment and tourism.

Development Directions

Based on the Revised Concept Plan for Lantau published in 2007 and the aforementioned strategic positioning of Lantau, the Lantau Development Advisory Committee has proposed the following four development directions:

1 Northern Lantau Corridor (For Economic and Housing Development)

With the HKIA, the Tung Chung New Town Extension project and other major infrastructure along its route, the Corridor can provide ample opportunities for housing, economic and commercial uses.

2 North-eastern Lantau Node (For Leisure, Entertainment and Tourism)

With new and diversified tourism and entertainment elements that complement the existing leisure facilities on north-eastern Lantau, Hong Kong's position as Asia's tourist hub and events capital can be reinforced.

3 East Lantau Metropolis (ELM) (Strategic Growth Area with a Core Business District)

Reclamation for one artificial island or more in the central waters to form an additional core business district and new town can serve Hong Kong's long-term needs in a sustainable manner. The ELM would adopt a smart, diverse and environmentally friendly new town concept with transport infrastructure connections to major districts on Hong Kong Island.

4 Predominant Part of Lantau (For Conservation, Leisure, Cultural and Green Tourism)

Most of Lantau is rich in ecological habitats, rural townships and cultural and heritage attractions. In preserving the island's intrinsic and unique qualities, there is a great potential for leisure, cultural and green tourism development on Lantau.
