Question: When compared with the revised estimated expenditure for 2003-04, the 2004-05 estimate marks a nearly fourfold increase in General non-recurrent expenses. Please explain why and give a breakdown for each item and the estimated expenses involved.

Asked by: Hon. CHAN Kam-lam

Reply:

The increase of \$7.748 million in expenditure is mainly due to the hiring of contractors for grass cutting on more vacant government land and contracting-out of Systematic Identification of Maintenance Responsibility of Slopes in the Territory (SIMAR) studies to identify the parties responsible for maintenance of registered man-made slopes. A breakdown of the expenditure is as follows:
