Question: Under the subhead of General non-recurrent, the revised estimated allocation for 2003-04 is over \$2.6 million but the provision for 2004-05 is over \$10 million. Why is there such an increase?

Asked by: Hon. TIEN Pei-chun, James

Reply:

The increase of \$7.748 million in expenditure is mainly due to the hiring of contractors for grass cutting on more vacant government land and contracting-out of Systematic Identification of Maintenance Responsibility of Slopes in the Territory (SIMAR) studies to identify the parties responsible for maintenance of registered man-made slopes. A breakdown of the expenditure is as follows:
